

SAVE TIME AND MONEY WHEN FILLING YOUR PRESCRIPTIONS

As a Blue Advantage member, you have several ways to help you save time and money when filling your covered drugs.



Use the Preferred Pharmacy Network

The Blue Advantage pharmacy network includes a group of participating pharmacies that offer preferred cost-sharing for your Medicare Part D prescriptions. That means you may pay less for your medication when you choose a preferred pharmacy. You can still use a non-preferred pharmacy, but you'll pay more for Tiers 1 – 3 drugs.

There are hundreds of preferred pharmacies available across the state, including many independent pharmacies, and thousands more nationwide.

To transfer a prescription to a preferred network pharmacy:

- Take your prescription bottle to a preferred network pharmacy and ask them to transfer it.
- Call the new pharmacy and ask them to contact your current pharmacy.
- Ask your doctor to send your prescription to the new pharmacy.

Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Louisiana HMO offers Blue Advantage (HMO). Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Louisiana, an independent licensee of the Blue Cross and Blue Shield Association, offers Blue Advantage (PPO).

Blue Advantage from Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Louisiana HMO is an HMO plan with a Medicare contract. Blue Advantage from Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Louisiana is a PPO plan with a Medicare contract. Enrollment in either Blue Advantage plan depends on contract renewal.

Get a 90-Day Supply

You can get a 90-day supply of most drugs, such as those used to treat high blood pressure, diabetes or high cholesterol. This is an easy way to make sure you always have your medicine on hand.

To fill a 90-day supply:

- You may need a new prescription. Ask your doctor to order a 90-day supply of the drug or have the pharmacy reach out to your doctor for you.
- For Tiers 1 drugs, a 90-day supply may save you money.

Use Mail-Order Delivery

With Express Scripts Pharmacy, you can have most drugs delivered right to your door. Plus, you pay nothing for standard shipping.
